A MESSAGE FROM FATHER BRYAN

Dear people of God,

Though the world around us seems to be lingering in Lent, we know that Christ is risen and dwells among us. We are people of the resurrection! And there are small signs of resurrection.

Thanks be to God, and with permission of the Bishop, we can begin video worship from the church again. A small sign of our hope in the resurrection amid a pandemic. We still are under Bishop's order not to gather for worship or meetings, no matter what the Governor says. I pray we all continue to practice hand washing, safe distances, and other best practices to care for our own health and the health of the most vulnerable.

Our parish office will reopen May 1 with a skeleton staff. However, I urge you to stay away, stay home, and handle any church business you have by phone or email.

We have launched a new feature on our website to allow giving online. Until we are able to gather in person, postal mail and online giving are the best ways to support our continuing ministry and mission.

And it does continue! Our people are praying the Daily Office of Compline on Facebook Live! every Monday - Thursday at 7pm. We are gathering virtually for Men's and Women's breakfast. Our Bible Study resumes online. The Vestry, Stewardship, Finance, and other teams are meeting and moving forward into God's purpose. Our Pastoral Care team is contacting people in an organized manner. You all are checking in on one another in an organic way. Our Outreach ministries and partners continue to serve those in need.

This may be an Easter like no other, but it is Easter nonetheless. Explore how God is revealing the resurrection to you. Discern how God is calling you to participate. Wherever you are, and at all times, give thanks and praise to our Lord and Savior. Christ is Risen!




