Loaves and Fishes Ministry

Loaves and Fishes Ministry, like most everyone, was affected by the pandemic that swept the country in 2020. We implemented CDC protocols at the center to protect both clients and staff. No one was allowed inside the center, so the staff worked to the best of their ability to bring services out to them. The city of Macon helped us set up showers outside. We provided hygiene kits and diapers if needed. We shifted our focus to the most basic need facing our community. Using the story of the “Loaves and Fishes” as our example, we became a feeding ministry. With generous gifts of money and food donations from local restaurants, we supplied over 300 meals each week to the hungry among us. We served Breakfast, Lunch and an afternoon meal Monday through Thursday. If we had food remaining after all were fed at the center, our dedicated staff took food to areas of the city where there was a need. Our clients were also fed spiritually from Bible studies and inspirational messages from Minister Debra Singleton at our outside “sanctuary”. Minister Singleton is a member of the Board of Directors and spends many hours giving encouragement to our clients. As conditions improve from the pandemic and we live in a healthier environment, Loaves and Fishes will return to assist clients on a path to self sufficiency.
