



Pastoral Update - Stacy Hinson

After evaluation by the Transplant Review Board, Stacy has been approved for kidney transplantation! The previous kidney transplant, donated by her brother Bob, served Stacy for almost 20 years. Truly a gift of life!

Stacy is now on the transplant list awaiting a donor. This is a bitter sweet prospect, as these desperately needed organs come from those who have lost their life and whose loved ones grieve, yet the donor had the foresight and compassion to register as an organ donor. The Hinson's are painfully familiar with this process as the organs donated after the tragic loss of their daughter Abby saved many lives. Please consider organ donation and let your loved ones know your intentions. As the saying goes, "Don't take your organs to heaven, heaven knows we need them here!"

There is also the prospect of a living kidney donor for Stacy, and a few loved ones have stepped forward to be tested for compatibility. Meanwhile, Stacy undergoes dialysis 3 times per week, 3.5 hours per session, to do the work her kidney cannot. It is a grueling, but live maintaining necessity. The goal of a new kidney may take months, or even years. The Hinson family continues to press on with faith and hope, propped up by your prayers and support. Thank you!



[Why do we pray each Sunday for the Diocese of Cape Coast, Ghana? What is this companion diocese partnership all about?](#)


The partnership with Cape Coast Ghana began in December of 2017. The purpose of this partnership is an effort to repair the breach begun 400 years ago and journey together toward reconciliation, healing, and spiritual growth. The relationship is mutually supportive in prayer, learning, and resources. Pilgrimages to Cape Coast have helped our diocese to better understand the culture and to build stronger ties of communication.

During these unique, divisive, and challenging times, as we connect via phone, zoom, emails and social media, let us recall our covenant guiding how we should interact with one another.

We Believe....

- Every voice is valuable, and should be respected and heard
- All opinions are equally considered and should be heard with an open mind
- No person or voice is more important than another, nor should override another.
- Open communications (inclusions, honesty, transparency, clarity) are necessary in a community of faith and trust.
- Conflict can be constructive and valuable when experienced with acceptance, consideration, forgiveness, and reconciliation.
- We should be hold each other accountable in relationship, but mainly hold ourselves accountable.

So we Covenant...

- To listen to each other with an open mind and loving heart
- To engage in active listening, giving our full attention, without argument, interruption, or preparation of a rebuttal.
- To seek to understand, more than to be understood, asking questions in authentic empathy.
- To share feelings openly, without accusation or blame, using "I" statements to communicate.
- To risk full disclosure and honesty in our relationships, and have patience with others doing the same.
- To refuse to participate in tolerate gossip, and to end gossip when encountered.
 - To talk to others rather than about others.
- To seek truth and honesty in our relationships, dealing in facts and first-hand communications.
- To be willing to grant, ask for, and accept forgiveness when we hurt each other, and seek reconciliation.
 - To de-personalize conflict, to disagree without being disagreeable.
 - To assume the best in each other, not jumping to conclusions.
- To assess and hold ourselves accountable in relationship, rather than judging others.


